About the logo design

The colours Yellow, Black and White

These colours were specifically chosen because they relate directly to the radiation icon as well as to the black/white appearance of

x-rays. I decided to place the logo on a black background as the white x-ray on black is a bit of a trademark of both fields. In this way, it mimics the qualities of a traditional x-ray display.

Reversing the two 'R's

Rather than creating two distinct logos for radiographers *vs* radiation therapists, I thought it would be more effective to unify them based on their common ground. So here, radiographers and radiation therapists are placed back to back, as equals, rather than implying one is better than the other. By making one black while the other is white, it also draws attention to their subtle differences, while emphasising their shared role in the use of radiation.

Why is the logo so simple?

Because quite simply, the best logos are always the simplest. Think Apple, Jetstar, Nike and Toyota. It will also make it easier to place on letterheads, webpages, etc.

About the tag line: 'Pushing Buttons Since 1895'

Some people might not like this slogan, because at first glance, it appears to tease radiographers/radiation therapists about our roles. However, I think this slogan brings a sense of humour to the week. Also, the reference to 1895 (the year Roentgen discovered x-rays) reminds us how radiation technologists are evolving and continue to do so. In other words, I'm proud to be a button-pusher. I know a lot of a lives have been greatly improved by my doing so.

About the slogan: Radiographers & Radiation Therapists – An essential link in healthcare Vanessa Bamba

What would healthcare be today without radiographers and radiation therapists? How would other members of the health-care team be effected?

I chose my slogan *Radiographers & Radiation Therapists – An essential link in healthcare* to reflect the impact these professionals have in health.
